

CHAPTER 73: MOTOR TRUCK TRAFFIC AND PARKING

§ 73.01 DEFINITION.

For the purpose of this chapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

MOTOR TRUCK or HEAVY EQUIPMENT. Every Vehicle designated, used, or maintained primarily for the transportation of property or equipment, and/or vehicles in excess of 8,000 pounds per axle or 15,000 pounds per gross weight.

§ 73.02 TRUCK TRAFFIC RESTRICTED.

(A) NO person shall operate any motor truck, loaded or partially loaded, upon any public street or alley within the city unless that street or alley had been designated as a truck route under this title or the operator of any truck has a private residential parking permit.

(B) Motor trucks being operated on public streets not designated as a truck route are exempt from the restrictions of this section if they are being operated for the specific purpose of:

- (1) Discharging or Picking up goods at any business or residence;
- (2) Going to or from a business or residence for purpose of repairs;
- (3) Servicing utility facilities or construction sites;

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(4) Emergency Vehicles; or

(5) City or City franchised vehicles

§ 73.03 TRUCK PARKING PROHIBITED.

(A) No person shall park a motor truck in any residentially designated area of a planned unit development zone of the city, unless and until a motor truck residential parking permit had been obtained from the city.

(B) No motor truck parking shall be allowed on the streets designated in Chapter 75, Schedules II(A), II(B), or II(C), of this code, except parking as is incidental to the vehicles and uses as described in § 73.02 above.

§ 73.04 MOTOR VEHICLE RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT.

(A) Application for a motor truck residential parking permit shall be made on forms provided by the city. A copy of this chapter shall be made a part of the application. The application and permit, when issued, will contain:

- (1) The date of the application or permit;
- (2) A description of the motor truck, size, and license number;
- (3) The name of legal owners of the motor truck and property;
- (4) The name of the primary driver of the motor vehicle;
- (5) A description of the property where the motor truck will be parked; and
- (6) The signature of the applicant, property owner, and motor truck owner.

(B) The permit is valid for the parking of the tractor or truck only, and valid in front of permitted residence only. It does not extend authority for the parking of trailers or vans. A variance may be obtained for parking of additional unloaded in-use trailers or vans.

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§ 73.05 VARIANCE; EXTENDED AUTHORITY RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT

(A) A fee of \$25 shall accompany an application for an extended authority residential parking permit. This fee may be charged by the City Council by resolution.

(B) The Recorder shall give written notice by first class mail to the occupants of the properties located within a distance of 200 feet in any direction from the external boundaries of the applicant's property.

(C) The City Council shall view the site of the application, consider responses from adjacent property owners, and consider special circumstances. Application will be approved or rejected at the first regular meeting following the regular meeting when the application was first presented.

§ 73.06 PERMIT APPROVAL; CONDITIONS

Approval of the unloaded motor truck residential parking permit or extended parking permit shall be conditioned on the following.

(A) The applicant shall be responsible for compliance with all ordinances and code provisions, including but not limited to, restrictions for parking of trucks on public streets, noise, noxious fumes, and home occupations. Failure to comply with any such ordinance or provision shall be grounds for termination of the permit. In addition, the city may revoke the permit upon 30 days' written notice to permit holder.

(B) The permit shall automatically terminate at such time as the applicant terminates residence at the address stated on the permit.

(C) The applicant shall use the most direct route available to move to and from the location granted within the permit, to an established truck route.

(D) The applicant shall maintain a valid residential parking permit at all times.

(E) Vans and trailers covered under the approved variance shall not remain stationary for more than one week.

(F) No truck or truck trailer will park closer than 20 feet from any intersection.
